When Jesus asks his listeners what the owner will do to the laborers, their answer is quick—dish out brutal punishment to the laborers and then give the work to people who respect the fact that the owner of the vineyard gets the harvest.

This parable—as do all of Jesus' parables—makes us wonder. For example, we wonder what in the world the laborers are thinking. It's a no-brainer, isn't it? The harvest belongs to the owner of the vineyard.

So, too, with the Kingdom of God. Living as faithful, Catholic Christians, we love God and we love one another—all for and *only* for the greater glory of God. Our works of mercy, charity, and love do not result in a "harvest" that we get to keep for ourselves—like praise, for example, or awards for "Best Good Person of the Year." Rather, our goodness is for the glory of God and the building of the Kingdom of God here in our midst, right now.

The Word: Matthew 21:33-43. Our acts of goodness are for the glory of God. This week's Gospel is another one of those stories—called parables— that Jesus uses to teach us about the Kingdom of God. This parable is about a group of laborers in a vineyard. They will not give the harvest to the vineyard owner, no matter what. In fact, the laborers kill those who come to collect the harvest; they kill even the owner's son.
