RELIGIOUS EDUCATION

The Word: Luke 9:28-36. We listen for Jesus' voice in our hearts. In today's Gospel, the voice from heaven speaks to the disciples saying, "Listen to him." The Transfiguration was a focused moment for the disciples when they heard God speaking to them and experienced Jesus in glory. They most certainly left this focused moment with a new appreciation for the importance of Jesus' words even if they did not yet understand everything that he had taught them. During Lent, we are invited to consider our attentiveness to Jesus and to one another. In the pace and noise that often characterizes family life, how well do we listen to one another?

What opportunities do we have for quiet prayer? As you gather as a family, count the number of pieces of equipment in your home that produce sound televisions, radios, CD players, computers, video games, etc. Observe if sometimes more than one piece of equipment is playing simultaneously and how this might affect communication.

Discuss the question: What is it like to

THE NEW ROMAN MISSAL

For almost 25 years, the English speaking bishops of the world have been working on a new translation of prayers we use in the celebration of Mass. After starts and stalls, the Order of Mass, all the prayers, prefaces, feasts, memorials, and commemorations have been approved by the bishops of the United States and sent to Rome for approval. It is anticipated that the Roman Missal, Third Typical Edition, will be implemented in 2011. With all the parts now approved by the United States bishops and awaiting Rome's recognition, it is not too early to begin to look at the new Missal and its translations which will shape our worship and prayer for generations to

try to talk with one another when this equipment is on?

Read aloud today's Gospel, Luke 9:28-36. Consider whether the noise and pace of your family life allows family members opportunities for quiet prayer. During Lent, it may be appropriate for your family to choose a time for quiet in the household by turning off televisions, radios, and CD players.

Consider whether your family would like to establish such a time during this Season of Lent and suggest that it might allow you the opportunity to listen more attentively to one another and to find time for quiet prayer. Spend a few such moments as a family, asking God to help you listen well to one another and to Jesus.

The Loads of Love Program

provides people with the opportunity to launder their own clothing and bedding. Vouchers are currently available through the School Counselors at Miami Trace Schools and Washington City Schools on a referral basis. Soon they will be available at the Well at Sunnyside also.

At this time there are two sessions: Tuesdays from 5-8 pm and Wednesdays from 11 am - 2 pm, at Sunshine Laundromat, 122 E East St. Through these two sessions, Loads of Love can provide 120 total loads of laundry each week to families or individuals in need.

Loads of Love can help a family make the most of what they already have. Clean Laundry is a confidence booster, helps people feel proud about themselves, and allows children to blend in better with their peers. People get a sense of accomplishment by doing for themselves. It also gives an opportunity for the next generation to learn the benefits of clean clothes and bedding, and the guidance to do it properly. In addition to all of that, it offers a sense of community to those in need. It gives warm and loving human interaction on which to build relationships.

Loads of Love is always looking for coin donations to pay for the cost of the machines. This is our greatest need at this time. Save your weekly pocket change, or every time you do a load of laundry at home, put a quarter in a cup. Donate these proceeds to the Loads of Love project. A coin box is in the back of church, or send a check payable to The Well at Sunnyside, 721 S. Fayette St., WCH. You can also volunteer your time and love to assist during one of the sessions.
