DIOCESE OF COLUMBUS
POLICIES AND GUIDELINES
FOR MARRIAGE PREPARATION
effective July 1, 2010

A Wedding Planner may not be involved in the liturgy. Preparation of the liturgy demands an understanding of liturgical practice, an understanding few wedding planners have. The proper province for a wedding planner is the reception following the wedding. This role is distinguished from that of a Parish-Appointed Wedding Coordinator who works closely with the officiating cleric and may assist with the liturgy.
